## Lake Erie Civilian Baitfish Group

### **Background:**

On June 9, 2009 there was a meeting of the DEC and the Lake Erie Civilian Baitfish Group. The meeting was initiated because of the current baitfish transport regulations and the non transport of minnows in vehicles in NY State, especially the Niagara River and Lake Erie in Region 9. The meeting was requested by Paul Stoos, Erie County Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs Second Vice President, in a letter dated April 24, 2009 to Helen Domske NY Sea Grant. It requested a meeting with DEC's Doug Stang, Jeremy(Steve) Hurst and Region 9's Abby Schneider. (See attached Document). The intention was to discuss the possibility of having the DEC consider changing the current regulations to allow the transport of baitfish in vehicles within a "Buffer Zone" along the Interstate 90 corridor (also defined in the attached letter).

Copies of the request letter were also sent to NY State Senator Dale Volker and Assemblywoman Francine DelMonte and DEC 's Paul McKeown. Jack Quinn and his aide "AJ" Wright, were spoken to at the "State of Lake Erie Meeting", April 30, 2009,

which was sponsored by Assemblyman Quinn, to request his help in trying to get the meeting with the DEC representatives. He said he would “see what he could to facilitate this meeting.”

Helen mentioned the request letter at the State of Lake Erie Meeting, and said that the DEC was considering the meeting here in Buffalo as requested and said that NY Sea Grant’s Dave MacNeill was assisting her. On May 15 Helen confirmed the meeting would take place on June 9, 2009 with the DEC and the persons that were requested (see “Paul.doc” attached).

### **Meeting Started at 9:20 AM**

Helen Domske started with an overview of the meeting and Sea Grants' involvement with VHSv and the science based information of it and how they have been working to get the information out. She thanked the Erie County Federation for writing a letter to get the meeting initiated and started. Mentioned Dr Paul Bowser is their contact and his many publications on VHSv.

Helen then introduced Dr. Dave MacNeill that gave a short background analysis of VHSv and its introduction into the Great Lakes and the unintended economic impacts that have been involved.

“If you don't like what is going on in the Great Lakes wait a minute it will change”

Helen then introduced Dave Barus, Erie County, that presented a 20 slide presentation on VHSv and the collaboration of ideas of understanding the resource, the other Lake Erie States and Providence of Ontario and their regulations.

Dave mentioned that there are at least 186 invasive species and that none were invited and that VHSv is one of the issues that are currently a problem. He summarized some of the issues associated and its introduction and spread across the Great Lakes. Especially, how NY State has taken the most conservative course of action to try to stop its spread. He covered the federal government and their regulations and their reaction to try to stop the spread of the virus through APHIS. Dave brought up that The Lake Erie and Niagara River are a small part of the overall area of NY State and the 9 regions, but this is a very big issue to the Lake Erie / Niagara River sportsmen and anglers. He highlighted, through pictures and videos, the quantity and what importance of the emerald shiner is to these sportsmen. Also stating that fishing without emerald shiners is not the same as the number of perch taken with any other type of bait. Numbers are greatly reduced

Responsible Sportsmen are concerned with the spread of VHSv and many of the other diseases and viruses that are tested for to have baitfish certified virus/disease free.

During the presentation Pat VanCamp mentioned that the certified emerald shiners that they purchase for their wholesale and retail business are not as hardy or strong as the ones that were previously dipped here in the Niagara River. Herb Schultz said that the emerald shiner is also found in huge numbers along the whole Lake Erie shoreline in the bays and small creeks entering Lake Erie, not just the Niagara River.

Also mentioned is the economic hardship on bait dealers along Lake Erie that could previously dip their own bait and retail it. Some are ready to close up and other stores are for sale. Bait dealers in WNY are having hard times compared to the dealers in the rest of the state which are actually doing better, especially in these hard economic times. The number and quantity of perch and sport fish on the whole are on the increase in the Eastern Basin of Lake Erie.

Dave introduced Rich Davenport who covered the statistical analysis of the numbers of licenses sold in Erie, Chautauqua and Niagara Counties compared to the rest of the state. He covered where he got the data from and how he analyzed it. The data was made equal by using the data from the 2006 US Fish and Wildlife and 2006 NY State sales numbers. He compared data showing the annual spending patterns for all Great Lakes fishermen and Lake Erie fishermen versus inland fishermen. Also shown was bait usage for the percentage of fishermen as compared to those that do not use bait, including the amount of annual sales per person. In 2006 there were around 125,000 licenses purchased in Erie, Niagara, and Chautauqua Counties.

**Discussion:**

A point that was brought up in the discussion was how VHS is spread, including bait wells, water and equipment Doug Stang said that they were currently trying to stop the 'fish to fish' spread of the disease, hence the current regulations. Fish to fish spread is the primary way of spreading the disease. He also said that they cannot stop birds from flying.

Steve Hurst is concerned with having a major outreach program should there be a regulation change. How could the federations and dealers help to educate the general fishing public. The representatives from all areas said their organizations could help to educate the anglers and sportsmen.

Capt. Bennett mentioned about enforcement and the ramifications of not being able to follow every vehicle if a regulation change were to take effect. Paul Stoos said that currently they actually have the same problem because once somebody reaches their destination and puts their boat in the water how can they tell where the bait came from. There are many holes in the current regulations, especially enforcement.

Doug Stang wanted our feelings on "if there was a regulation change would the average angler follow the new rules?" The overall feeling of the participants was that they would. Steve Hurst wanted to know if the Federations and organizations would help out in an extreme outreach program and the answer was a definite yes. Tom Marks said he actually talked to thousands of anglers every year in the invasive species seminars he conducts. It would be nothing at all to add this into his seminars. Dave Barus said that at bait shops and access sites and areas where fishermen collect bait they could put up signs to educate them against transporting the baitfish to other waters.

Steve Hurst gave an example of the pond in Niagara County that got infected by a "good Samaritan" that was trying to save bait that was found in a nearby creek that was drying up.. She collected some of the bait and put them in her own pond and her fish died and were tested and after questioning she admitted transporting and dumping the bait in her pond.

Steve Hurst said that VHSv is consuming almost 70% of his time. This is a gargantuan problem.

Somebody asked about the possibility of certified fish diluting the current genetic strain of our local fishes and yes it is a small possibility.

Paul Jackson spoke on their walleye fry rearing ponds and how for 20 years they had no problem. However, this year they have to pay to have their walleye fingerlings certified and unless they can find a corporate sponsor they will have no other option but to kill all their fish.

Steve Hurst asked if there was a State Regulation that said you can only use bait in the same body where it came from would this solve our problem. He said to think about this seriously.

He said that Chautauqua Lake has the same problem. If a person dips in the south end of the lake they want to take them to the other end of the lake.

Towards the end of the presentation and the beginning of the discussion Steve Hurst asked “what actually we were looking for?”

Paul Stoos answered that we were looking to be able to transport bait in a vehicle along a corridor from Niagara Falls to the Pennsylvania line and West of Interstate 90. Paul Jackson from Niagara County and Zen Olow also stated that their respective counties would like the same thing. Steve Hurst said he was trying to get at exactly what we were looking for. By having us define exactly what we were looking for he answered that we have something unique here but only in magnitude compare to other parts of the state. He said the last thing they wanted to do was to start drawing lines or zones around every body of water. He also said that other areas, Lake Oneida and Lake Chautauqua have the same problem and asked if “using bait that was dipped in a body of water could only be used in that same body of water would fit the definition of what we were looking for.” All parties seemed to agree with that. Steve then stated he was trying to determine just what are needs are exactly. One point that was brought up was dealers being able to be able to sell uncertified bait. This would mean all bait would be uncertified in the shop.

Helen asked about “if there was a state regulation to be able to transport bait only in the same body of water this would this solve the Region 9 issue for Lake Erie and the Niagara River while doing the same for the rest of the lake. The answer was a definite yes. She said that it sounded like The DEC is trying to work with us. She asked what the DEC wanted from the Federations and anglers to move this forward. Steve Hurst said that a massive outreach program to educate the anglers so they did not believe there was no longer a problem. They want to prevent moving any virus or disease to any other waters.

Steve said they do not need anything to help move it forward. This is just a listening meeting. They are not saying they will change the regulations. “We are just talking today”.

Steve Hurst said” I believed when the regulations were originally put into effect and what they are now, is what they should be. I believed it then and I believe it now.” “My job is to protect the fisheries of this State”.

The discussion turned to Pat VanCamp and the Commercial part of the business versus the retail part. It was noted that her wholesale part of the business in this region has decreased so much that it would not be cost effective to do it again. She noted that the rest of the state bait dealers are doing very well while this region is closing up. Emerald shiners would be welcome with open arms at Penrods, Dave’s in Derby and Miller’s. This is a major part of those businesses.

Pat also said that the anglers coming into their business are aware of the regulations while very few are not aware of them.

Rich Davenport asked if was possible to have a “pilot project” to try the transportation of bait in the Lake Erie / Niagara River. Steve Hurst did not believe so. Rich said there will be many challenges for all, but working together would be the best answer. He tried to express the idea to them that the biggest economic engine is Lake Erie with 24% of the state licensed anglers here and that a pilot project here would be the best way to test changing the regulations. He asked them to set some hard rules for a pilot project.

Helen then thanked Dave and Rich for their hard work and doing such a great job of putting on very professional presentations. She then thanked the DEC for coming and listening to us and making them aware of what is going on in this end of the state. She commented on how cordial and professional a meeting it was. She asked all of us to come up with some ideas and said she did not think a letter writing campaign would be a good idea.

Paul Stoos asked if a follow up meeting could be scheduled to see where the DEC is at any new ideas or options could be presented. Steve Hurst said “ may be able to entertain that” Paul then invited the DEC to come to Chautauqua County for the Charterboat Association / Politician Fishing Day which is used to promote our great fishery. The DEC said that it does not look good when this happens and declined.

Paul also summarized that fishing with anything other than emerald shiners is not the same. He also brought to their attention that taking a youngster to dip minnows the night before going fishing was even more enjoyable when the kids get to dip a bucket of minnows and use them the next day. All this is part of the education of the kids.

Dave MacNeill said the next step might be to go back to our respective organizations and let them know that the discussions were open and honest. Get a read to where they want to go. Sea Grant said they would be more than willing to help us with an outreach program. He said there was an amazing amount of misinformation out there.

Helen once again thanked everybody and said that she would do what she could to bring this group back together again to promote the changes that we desire.

The meeting ended at 12:30 PM

Tony Gonnello states that NYB is “never working with us”, why should we support John Susz says should oppose, would be a good period for crossbows.

Rich Davenport clarified that during big game committee meeting, it was put forth to compromise and move the early archery season up by seven days, to the last Saturday before Columbus Day, which would effectively keep the opener on a Saturday, while also setting opener on a Holiday weekend (especially for school kids that get that Monday off). Sets up a long weekend, good for everyone. Martin Seeley of NYB stated this compromise could be certainly worked with.

**09-06 – Moose Hunting**

Rich D clarified the proposal and the issues as written. Population is at a point where management may be needed, as car collisions are way up, and moose numbers are estimated to be @ 500 animals in NYS. Resolution as written specifically calls for no management plan, which is contrary to NAWCM. However, if written to direct DEC to establish a management plan, this would work. Oppose as written is recommended.

**09-07 – Firearms Handling Age**

Tony Gonnello asks if Penal Law applies on private property with kids handling firearms under adult supervision who are under 12? Answer is YES!

**09-08 – VDC Support of \$1.00 for every Big Game license sold to Venison sub-account**

Rich addresses the concerns and potential issues surrounding this well-intentioned resolution and asks all to consider deeply these potential issues before deciding on support or oppose.

**09-09 – Withdrawn**

***09-10 – Mandatory Consumption Law for Game Animals***

***09-11 – Hunter Ed refresher courses***

Adam Z – discussed at West Falls, would be tough to do considering the already stretched resources of the volunteer instructors. Also can take the hunter safety course again, if so desired!

***09-13 – Dog Collar***
